Term 201210 (Fall 2011)

As part of its learning-centered orientation, Valencia College creates for its public school district partners this report addressing selected performance elements of current dual-enrolled students, previous year high school graduates, former Career Pathways students, and high school alumni who have also attended and/or graduated from Valencia. All data was run at the end of the Fall 2011 term, and provides information on public high school graduates in Orange and Osceola counties.

Executive Summary: Service District

Dual-Enrolled Students

During Term 201210 (Fall 2011), there were **1,807 dual-enrolled students** from the Valencia's service district, comprised of Orange and Osceola Counties. These students simultaneously receive high school and college credit.

Previous Year High School Graduates (PYHSGs)

In Term 201210 (Fall 2011), of Valencia's service district previous year public high school graduates,

- 3,733 enrolled at Valencia.
- **2,887** were **first-time-in-college (FTIC)** students; that is, they had no previous college credit of any kind. This figure excludes graduates who were dual-enrolled as high school students.
 - **92** participated in Valencia's **Honors Program**.
 - 1,552 received scholarships at Valencia.
 - 342 were named to the President's Honor List; 401 were named to the Dean's Honor List.
 - 1,966 participated in Career Pathways while in high school.
 - **76.3%** of the service area's FTIC, PYHSGs took **placement tests** prior to entering Valencia.
 - 46.0% were mandated into at least one developmental education course.
 - 26.7% placed into developmental education reading; 21.4% placed into developmental education writing; and 36.5% placed into developmental education mathematics.
 - **75.9%** of **Out of District & InDistrict, NonPublic HS students were** first-time-in-college, previous year high school graduates took **placement tests** prior to entering Valencia. Of these students,
 - 49.9% were required to take at least one developmental education course.
 - 29.3% placed into developmental education reading; 24.7% placed into developmental education writing; and 41.4% placed into developmental education mathematics.
 - **33.1**% of public high school students who graduated from Orange and Osceola County schools in 2011 attended Valencia in Fall 2011.
 - 83.1% of the Service District's PYHSGs who began classes in Fall 2011 returned to Valencia in Spring 2012.

Valencia Attendance (through December 2011)

Of all students attending Valencia Community College,

- 165,791 graduates of Orange and Osceola County public high schools attended Valencia since 1967.
- 40,741 of these public high school graduates attended Valencia since Fall 2007.

Valencia Graduates (since January 2007)

Of all students receiving degrees at Valencia Community College,

- 54,826 graduates from public high schools in Valencia's service area earned degrees since 1967.
- 21,274 graduates from public high schools in the service area earned degrees at Valencia since January 2007.

Dual-Enrolled Students

Dual-enrolled students are those who have not graduated from high school, have been accepted into the Dual-Enrollment program, and who are simultaneously receiving college and high school credit. Dual-enrolled students may be members of a class taught in a high school in the service district or may be enrolled in a course on a Valencia campus with the approval of the Dual-Enrollment Office. Dual-enrolled students are either shown as FTAV (First-Time-at-Valencia) or Continuing Dual-Enrolled, signifying that the student is still enrolled in high school, but has completed a dual-enrolled course in a previous semester.

Previous Year High School Graduates

In Term 201210 (Fall 2011), 3,733 previous year high school graduates from public high schools in Orange and Osceola counties enrolled and attended Valencia. Most were first-time-in-college and some had completed dual-enrolled courses prior to high school graduation. FTICs (First-time-in-college) are FTAV (First-Time-at-Valencia), have no transfer credits, no transfer or transient status, and <u>are not</u> Dual-Enrolled/Early Admission/Early Enrollment

FTIC DE (Former Dual Enr) are dual-enrolled students as indicated by their admission status field, and who have a high school graduation date within the previous 95 days of the beginning date of the term. As such, they are considered to be in their first term at Valencia since their recent high school graduation.

Returners are all others who have come back for subsequent terms at Valencia Community College.

Honors Program Participation

A total of 92 previous year high school graduates from Valencia's service district were enrolled in Valencia's Honors Programs during the Fall 2011 term. The table below shows the breakout by county.

President's and Dean's Honor Lists

Previous year high school graduates from the service district were recognized for their academic achievement by being named to the President's Honor List with a grade point average of 3.75 and above or to the Dean's Honor List with a grade point average of 3.5 to 3.74. Full-time students are eligible for the President's or Dean's Honor Lists upon completion of 12 credit hours of college-level work during a term. Part-time students are eligible for honors recognition after completing increments of 12 credit hours of college-level work over multiple terms.

Remediation Report (Mandate Rates)

When previous year high school graduates apply for admission as degree seekers, they take Florida's Postsecondary Education Readiness Test (P.E.R.T.) required by the State of Florida, or they present an ACT or SAT score. These test scores place the student into either developmental education or college-level courses in English, reading, or mathematics. The developmental education course may be at the first or second level; generally the first level is for up to ninth grade work, while the second level is for tenth to twelfth grade work. Remediation rates are computed for previous year high school grads (PYHSGs) who are first-time-in-college degree seekers, including students who were dual enrolled prior to their high school graduation. Placement levels for previous year high school graduates from the service district are shown below.

College-Ready Students (No Mandates)

One measure of college readiness is when the student is exempt from taking developmental education courses by virtue of scoring above certain scores on the ACT, the SAT, or Florida's Postsecondary Education Readiness Test (P.E.R.T.). The number of students scoring above the cut scores for English, reading, and mathematics is shown below. The following table counts all previous year high school graduates (PYHSGs) enrolled in Fall Term 201210 (Fall 2011) regardless of whether the fall term was their first term of enrollment.

Career Pathways (formerly Tech Prep)

Students begin Career Pathways in high school focusing on higher academics and technical skills, then link their high school studies with at least two years at an Orange or Osceola county technical school or Valencia College. This can lead to a two-year certificate, associate's degree, or a four-year college degree.

After taking designated technical courses at their high schools, Career Pathways students participate in an assessment and are eligible to receive credit when they enroll at Valencia. By earning college credit while in high school, students make a smooth transition between high school and college by not duplicating coursework and save time and tuition/book money. The number of Career Pathways students from Orange and Osceola County high schools is shown below.

Degrees Awarded (since January 2007)
