Valencia is ranked 2nd among the nation's 2-year institutions and 5th among 2- & 4-year colleges and universities in the number of Associate degrees awarded.

96% of Valencia's Associate in Science/Applied Science degree graduates are placed in jobs after graduation earning an average annual salary of \$42,308.

83.5% of Valencia AA graduates who transferred to the Florida State University System in Fall 2007 continued their studies at the University of Central Florida.
