Part of the funding received from AAA/ICDR was for OSU to lead development of five pilot project case studies that describe local dispute resolution responses and planning initiatives that address controversies and confrontations that divide communities. Orlando was identified as case study site, and the case study work will be completed by Valencia Peace and Justice Institute as a \$5,000 sub-award from OSU.
