4. Regular Agenda:

1920-019 PAX 1500 Conflict Transformation: Paths to Peace, CCM...C. Kavalec

Purpose: Enrollment for PAX 1500 has been low for a few years. When courses are scheduled, many times there is not sufficient enrollment for the course to run. These intended curricular changes adjust the focus of the course to include more practical application-based approaches to conflict management. With the curriculum changes that include addressing conflict management in the workplace, we are hoping to boost enrollment and offer an important skill-based course to Valencia business students and other populations; **Revised Course Title:** Introduction to Conflict Management; **Revised Course Description:** This course introduces positive conflict management processes and skills critical for leadership and human flourishing. While conflict is natural and a critical agent for change and transformation, it can also lead to undesirable outcomes such as damaged relationships, alienation, and even violence. Achieving a favorable outcome in conflict depends on HOW we navigate conflict--which requires skills many of us have never been taught. In this course, students will learn to self-regulate, listen actively, mediate, negotiate, communicate effectively, and identify resources to support effective conflict resolution in a personal, organization, or societal context; **Effective Date:** Fall 2020 (202110).

The presenter explained that this class typically has low enrollment and sometimes the class gets cancelled. They thought about how they can adjust the curriculum to offer it as part of other programs. They have integrated business management concepts and work circumstances.

A committee member proposed removing any marketing material from the course description. The course description was changed to: This course introduces positive conflict management processes and skills critical for leadership and human flourishing. Students will learn to self-regulate, listen actively, mediate, negotiate, communicate effectively, and identify resources to support effective conflict resolution in a personal, organization, or societal context.

Proposal 1920-019 was approved with the above change.

1920-020 Medical Office Management Certificate, CPM.....B. Wanielista

Purpose: Delete Medical Office Management Electives course list. Change the Electives to read: All OST-prefix courses not being used as a requirement in this degree except OST 1141; **Effective Date:** Fall 2020 (202110).

The presenter explained that they seek to broaden elective opportunities instead of sticking to a more prescribed list of courses.

Proposal 1920-020 was approved by consensus.

1920-021 A.S. in Live Entertainment Design and Production, CPM.....K. Abel

Purpose: This change is intended to make a specialized track in this program easier to articulate with the Entertainment Management Bachelor's degree at UCF's Rosen College of Hospitality Management. It will also provide another elective option for the Live Production specialization students; **Effective Date:** Fall 2020 (202110).

Proposal 1920-021 was approved by consensus.

1920-022 ETM 1602C Automated Electrical Systems and Devices, CCM

.....Deb Hall

Purpose: To better prepare students to successful within this course; **Revised Prerequisite:** ETM 1600C; PHY 1020 or any Gen Ed Math; **Effective Date:** Fall 2020 (202110).

It was explained that the faculty are finding that students need a stronger foundation to be successful in the course.

The prerequisites were changed to: ETM 1600C, ETM 1601C, and one of the following: PHY 1020, MAC 1105 or higher, MGF 1106, MGF 1107, STA 2023

Proposal 1920-022 was approved with the above changes.

1920-023 A.S. in Energy Management and Controls Technology, CPM.....D. Hall

Purpose: The ETD 1031C course would better prepare our EMCT students for academic and industry success than the SLS 1122: "New Student Experience" course. PHY 1020 or any Gen Ed math would prepare our EMCT students for academic and industry success and would also allow them to complete our degree in a timely manner; **Effective Date:** Fall 2020 (202110).

The presenter explained that they would like to replace the New Student Experience course with ETD 1031C. A commit member explained the multiple financial aid implications that can come about because of a chance like this.

Another committee member explained that students with the SLS course may not be as successful as a student with ETD 1031C. He went on to say that other areas may want to look into developing a similar course because it has been proven that the students with the ETD course are more successful in the program.

Proposal 1920-023 was approved by consensus and then reverted at the February 2020 meeting. Information item from the February meeting below.

A part of proposal 1920-023 from the January meeting was reverted to what it was originally. A program advisor noted that SLS 1122 counts as one of the 15 required Gen. Ed. credits so ETD 1031C was removed and SLS 1122 was put back in the program. PHY 1020 or any Gen. Ed. math will remain.

Purpose: Course title was changed to something not congruent with the other period humanities courses, or with the same course at other institutions; **Revised Course Title:** Medieval Humanities; **Effective Date:** Fall 2020 (202110).

1920-025 HUM 2223H The Middle Ages-Honors, CCM.....George Brooks
Purpose: Course title was changed 2 years ago to something not congruent with the other period humanities courses, and not aligned with the same course at our sister institutions. This is to rectify that error; **Revised Course Title:** Medieval Humanities-Honors; **Effective Date:** Fall 2020 (202110).

1920-026 EGS 2004 Electrical Networks, CCD.....Mohua Kar
Purpose: This course is equivalent to UCF's EEL-3004C Linear Circuits I. UCF had included 2 hours per week Lab in their course since last year so we are also including labs to make it equivalent to UCF's course. Please see the attached supporting document - UCF Catalog description.docx. We would like to have this additional hours of class time to improve students' performance. This extra lab hours will be used for active learning activities and some hands on experiments (lab projects); **Revised Course Number:** EGS 2004C; **Revised Credit/Contact/Lab hours:** 3/5/2; **Effective Date:** Fall 2020 (202110).

1920-026A EGS 2004C Electrical Networks, CCA.....Mohua Kar
Purpose: This course is equivalent to UCF's EEL-3004C Linear Circuits I. UCF had included 2 hours per week Lab in their course since last year so we are also including labs to make it equivalent to UCF's course. Please see the attached supporting document - UCF Catalog description.docx. We would like to have this additional hours of class time to improve students' performance. This extra lab hours will be used for

active learning activities and some hands on experiments (lab projects); **Revised Course Number:** EGS 2004C; **Credit/Contact/Lab hours:** 3/5/2; **Prerequisites:** Minimum grade of C in MAC 2312, and PHY 2049C; Pre **or Corequisite:** MAP 2302; **Catalog Course Description:** Analysis and design of linear circuits, transients, AC analysis, power calculations, three-phase circuits; **Effective Date:** Fall 2020 (202110).

EGS 2004 and EGS 2004C are equivalent.

Purpose: Change the course number of EGS 2004 to EGS 2004C. Add "Materials Science and Engineering" specialization; **Effective Date:** Fall 2020 (202110).

**1920-028 DAA 2610C Dance Composition & Improvisation I for Pre-Majors,
CCM.....S. Salapa**
Purpose: Upon discussion with dance faculty and potential transfer institutions, two credit hours for this course does satisfy the choreography transfer credit. The additional credit is suggested for use towards a technique class and/or performing credit. This adjustment also enables dancers to continue to enhance their technique and adhere to graduation requirements; **Revised Credit/Contact/Lab hours:** 1-3/Variable/0; **Effective Date:** Fall 2020 (202110).

The presenter explained that institutions are asking that students transferring to them have more training.

**1920-034 CNT 2000C Network Automation with Scripting Languages, CCA
..... W. Yousif**

Purpose: Adding a new intermediate-level course to the Associate in Science degree in Cybersecurity & Network Engineering Technology; **Credit/Contact/Lab:** 3/4/1; **Prerequisites:** CET 2660C, CET 2792C, and CET 1610C; **Co-requisites:** None; **Catalog Course Description:** This course starts by providing an introduction to network automation, Software defined networks (SDN), and various applications of network automation, which include integrating DevOps tools to automate the network efficiently. It then guides the student through different network automation tasks and covers various data digging and reporting methodologies such as IPv6 migration, Domain Control (DC) relocations, and interface and data parsing, all the while retaining security and improving data center robustness. The course covers the use of Python scripting and the management of SSH keys for machine-to-machine (M2M) communication, all followed by practical use cases for network automation. The course concludes with testing automated networks using different tools; **Effective Date:** Fall 2020 (202110).
