



FINDINGS: CHALLENGES

- Lack of efficient public transportation options
- Lack of information about college admissions process for parents and families, particularly in Spanish
- Application process for financial aid is complicated
- Many parents did not attend college; expectation for students to support family financially
- Many students lack a stable home environment
- Need to improve curriculum alignment
- Students don't understand value of higher education
- Too few counselors/career specialists in high schools
