Unity at the Campus level	Issue: Uniting Student Government	Issue: Uniting the East Campus Student Body

This year, three of the campuses (East Campus, West Campus and Osceola Campus) made a commitment to the state by running and getting elected to the District 2 Executive board in the organization FCSSGA.
