<p>Ideas42 (non-profit) Request for Problems; Using Behavioral Economics for Postsecondary Success (funding through the Citi Foundation)</p>	<p>The first phase of this project is to identify a behavioral problem. VC's proposed problem is: <i>New students complete the application, entry assessment test, and attend a required three hour new student orientation, but do not complete course enrollment; they should actually start college classes.</i></p> <p>20-25 colleges are invited to a Masterclass to learn more about the framework for diagnosing behavioral problems and designing behavioral interventions. If chosen, we will apply for financial assistance for travel and accommodation costs to attend the class on October 7 & 8 in Philadelphia. If selected, Valencia will request financial assistance to attend the Masterclass, if available.</p> <p>If chosen for the second phase, as a partner, we will receive \$250,000 to work in collaboration with the Ideas42 organization to design and test behavioral economics interventions that can potentially impact students' postsecondary outcomes. Workforce Florida Quick Response Training (QRT) Project Director: Joe Battista</p>	<p>The QRT Program provides grant funding for customized training to new or expanding businesses. By Florida Statute 288.047(3), as a public postsecondary institution, Valencia serves as fiscal agent for companies located within its service district. Valencia will provide application development and fiscal management services to Siemens Energy for their QRT grant application. Siemens Energy is relocating its wind service location to Orlando and is hiring 17 high-skill-high-wage positions over a 24 month period. Valencia is supporting the company by providing application review and submission and if funded, will provide monthly invoicing service to the company for reimbursement by Workforce Florida. Training will be provided by Siemens Energy in-house trainers. 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<p>Department of Justice, National Institute of Corrections -- subaward from Orange County Corrections</p> <p>Executive Excellence a Training and Development Program for Correctional Executives Cooperative Agreement</p> <p>Project Director: Carolyn McMorran</p>	<p>The broad goal of this project is to develop a training that meets the significant unfilled leadership development need for individuals in the field of corrections. Orange County Corrections will make the subaward to Valencia for Continuing Education to expand and adapt their current leadership course. Continuing Education will develop 20 hours of classroom content. The content for the training will emphasize leadership skill building, exposure to ethical and value based issues, self-awareness, strategic thinking, team oriented performance, effective decision making, executive visioning, mission and agenda setting, executive planning, politics of corrections both internally and externally as well the dynamics of creating collaborative partnerships in the external environment.
