Federal laws/guidance on campus sexual assault:





SCHOOLS ARE REQUIRED TO



IF AN INSTITUTION KNOWS ABOUT

on the basis of sex, including sexual harassment and acts of sexual violence against students in educational programs or activities operated by recipients of Federal financial assistance.

## HARASSMENT

that creates a hostile environment, Title IX requires the school to take immediate action to eliminate the harassment, prevent its recurrence and address its effects.



A TITLE IX COORDINATOR

oversees issues relating to gender



The Clery Act requires that colleges and universities report crime statistics on campuses, while protecting confidentiality and alerting the public to any possible incidents on campus.

#### SCHOOLS MUST:

equity in education



#### PUBLISH AN ANNUAL

#### SECURITY REPORT

with information on campus policies on crime, preventative education and statistics.



regarding crimes that present an ongoing threat to the campus community.

# CAMPUS SaVE

Passed as an amendment to the 2013 reauthorization of the Violence Against Women Act, it expands the Clery Act to more proactively address prevention and investigation of sexual assault in higher education.



## CLARIFIES **STANDARDS**

for institutional disciplinary procedures.

## REQUIRES INCREASED



in relation to reporting of annual campus crime statistics.





## **BE THE ONE TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE.**

How colleges and universities can act to prevent sexual assault and support survivors:

## SCHOOLS MUST:



all reports of violence and abuse seriously and investigate to find the best potential remedy.



ongoing training for faculty and staff, as well as prevention and awareness programs for students to address issues of sexual assault, dating/domestic violence, and stalking.



that survivors can continue their educational efforts and understand their rights with the reporting and investigation process. This includes access to interim measures such as class transfers, academic accommodations and mental health support.

## VALENCIA COLLEGE WILL:



all reporting and responding parties with respect.



a prompt and fair process for all parties involved.



## PROVIDE

appropriate training to promote a safe and inclusive college environment for students, staff and faculty.
