In breakout conversations, follow-up on the ACC transfer readiness conversation from the [ACC meeting - Year 4 on 03 28 24.docx](#). Identify indicators of “readiness for transfer to a Bachelor’s degree program.” Are there indicators in the response to some of the questions posed by Isis Artze Vega at the UCF Transfer Success Conference:

What does a Future Knight know? What do they know from an academic perspective? But what do they know about UCF? About its culture? Systems? traditions?

What are they able to do? Not just cognitively, but also navigationally? Are they able to navigate a new institution, form new connections with new peers, ask for help, advocate for themselves...

How does a transfer ready student feel? Uneasy and scared? Or ready to embrace the new and confident in their ability to thrive?

Intention to make actionable decisions on how to move forward. Collegewide stakeholders will be invited to the discussion, including members of the AA Degree Pathway ALTs.
