This will be an assignment that will require the use of 'expressions' or other forms of automated animation. Additionally, it will require the use of different input devices and require the student to use additional software to create assets, with a final delivery that can itself be used as an asset in other projects.

We will create a rubric specific to measuring whether students have designed a 'compelling' motion graphic.
