Valencia is ranked 1st among the nation's 2-year institutions and 4th among 2- & 4-year colleges and universities in the number of Associate degrees awarded (2008//2009 AY).

95% of Valencia's Associate in Science/Applied Science degree graduates are placed in jobs after graduation earning an average annual salary of \$44,680.

88.7% of Valencia AA graduates who transferred to the Florida State University System in Fall 2008 continued their studies at the University of Central Florida.
