Level 1

- Understand and use articles, adjectives, prepositions, and simple verbs at the low-beginner level.
- Write short affirmative and negative statements and questions using basic word order.
- Recognize all letters of the English alphabet and identify contextualized words and phrases.
- Identify the main ideas, some details and keywords from short recordings.
- Present basic information, ask and answer basic questions on familiar topics in conversations.
- Produce basic phonemes, stress and intonation in a manner appropriate for the low-beginner level.
- Understand and use present progressive, future past, and modals at the low-beginner level.
- Produce basic phonemes, stress and intonation in a manner appropriate for the low-beginner level

Level 2

- Understand and use simple present, present progressive, count/non-count nouns, conjunctions, and simple past at the mid-beginner level.
- Write short passages about daily life using basic sentence structure.
- Read and understand key words, cognates, formulaic expressions, and simple information in highly contextualized texts.
- Identify the main ideas, some details, and keywords from short recordings and answer follow-up questions.
- Present basic information in prepared or spontaneous speech and ask and answer basic questions on familiar topics in conversations.
- Produce basic phonemes, stress, and intonation in single words and full sentences in a manner appropriate for the midbeginner level.
- Understand and use prepositions, WH question words, infinitives, future, imperatives, conjunctions, and adjectives at the mid-beginner level.

- Understand and use simple present and present progressive tenses at the high-beginner level.
- Write short, well-organized paragraphs in the present time using level appropriate grammar and correct formatting with correct punctuation and capitalization.
- Read simple text to identify and understand cause/effect relationships, the main idea, supporting details, and paraphrasing using context clues for comprehension.
- Identify the main ideas, major details and keywords from short recordings about familiar topics and answer followup questions.
- Present basic information in prepared or spontaneous speech or a basic summary of an oral report.
- Respond appropriately to daily life situations on familiar topics.

 - Identify or summarize the main ideas, major details and keywords, infer meaning from recordings and answer follow-up questions.
 - Present simple information in a prepared or spontaneous speech or a simple summary of an oral report.
 - Respond appropriately to daily life situations and support an opinion.
 - Identify and produce phonemes, stress, rhythm and intonation patterns in single words and full sentences in a manner appropriate for the low-intermediate level.
- Understand and use modals, nouns, modifiers, and comparisons at the low-intermediate level.
- Write short well-organized paragraphs in the present, past, and future time using level appropriate grammar and correct formatting with correct punctuation and capitalization and appropriate transition signals while using simple and compound sentences.

- Identify and produce phonemes, stress, rhythm and intonation patterns in single words, longer full sentences, and conversations in a manner appropriate for the high-intermediate level.
- Understand and use adjective clauses, gerunds, infinitives, and noun clauses at the high-intermediate level.
- Write well-organized paragraphs in the present, past, and future time using level appropriate grammar and correct formatting with correct punctuation and capitalization and appropriate transition signals for different genres while incorporating complex sentences and focusing on strengthening paragraph unity.

- Read texts written in all major time frames to identify the main ideas, details, fact versus opinion, purpose, tone, and bias, and make connections to unfamiliar topics.
- Identify or summarize the main ideas, major details and keywords and infer meaning from 8-10-minute recordings about a variety of complex topics and answer comprehension questions.
- Present well-organized information on challenging topics in a prepared speech or a thorough summary of an oral report.
- Respond appropriately to problems, offer solutions, and thoroughly support an opinion.
- Identify and produce phonemes, stress, rhythm and intonation patterns in single words, longer full sentences, and conversations in a manner appropriate for the low-advanced level.
- Reproduce in notes the main ideas and details from a short lecture using symbols, and abbreviations. Respond to comprehension questions.
- Understand and use nouns, pronouns, and modals at the low-advanced level.
- Understand the parts of an essay and write well-organized cause and effect essays using level appropriate grammar and correct formatting with appropriate cause and effect transition signals while incorporating a variety of sentence types.
- Reproduce in organized notes the main ideas and details from a short lecture using symbols, abbreviations and respond to comprehension questions.

- Understand and use passive voice, adjective clauses, gerunds, and infinitives at the mid-advanced level.
- Understand the parts of an essay and write well-organized comparison and contrast essays using level appropriate grammar and correct formatting with appropriate comparison and contrast transition signals while incorporating a variety of sentence types.

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- Read argumentative and/or unfamiliar texts to identify the main ideas, summarize information, infer author intended meaning, and use context clues to gather meaning.
- Identify or summarize the main ideas, major details and keywords and infer meaning from 10-15-minute recordings about a variety of academic topics and answer comprehension questions.
- Present well-organized information on academic topics in a prepared speech or a thorough summary of an oral report, analyze thoroughly a problem, offer solutions, and support an opinion with research.
- Identify and produce phonemes, stress, rhythm and intonation patterns in single words, longer full sentences, and conversations in a manner appropriate for the mid-advanced level.
- Reproduce in well-organized notes the main ideas and details from a 10-15-minute lecture using symbols, abbreviations, and diagrams and respond to comprehension questions.
- Understand and use noun clauses, reduced adverb clauses, connectives, and conditionals at the mid-advanced level.
- Identify the parts of an essay, rebut opposing arguments, and write well-organized argumentative essays using level
 appropriate grammar and correct formatting with appropriate contrast transition signals while incorporating a variety
 of sentence types.
- Reproduce in well-organized, annotated notes the main ideas and details from a 10-15-minute lecture using symbols, abbreviations, and diagrams, and respond to comprehension questions.

- Read professional, academic, or literary texts with specialized vocabulary to identify the main ideas and summarize information, and draw inferences from contextual and extralinguistic cues.
- Identify or summarize the main ideas, major details and keywords and infer meaning from 15-30-minute recordings about a variety of professional and scientific topics and answer comprehension questions to initiate group discussions and debates.
- Present well-organized information on professional or scientific topics in a well-designed speech, analyze thoroughly problems, offer solutions, and support opinions with research and reliable references.
- In well-organized, annotated notes, reproduce the main ideas and details from a 15-20-minute lecture using symbols, abbreviations, diagrams, and charts, and respond to comprehension questions.
