Program Overview

The Associate in Science Degree in Radiography at Valencia College is a limited-access, six-term program designed for students seeking to become a radiographer. Admission to Valencia College does not guarantee admission to the Radiography Program. This guide outlines program eligibility, admission requirements, application steps, and key deadlines to support applicants through the admission process.

Admission Requirement Updates

- The courses CGS 1060C (Introduction to Computers) and CGS 2100C (Computer Fundamentals and Applications) will no longer be considered for additional admission points in the Radiography program selection process.

Program Location & Delivery Format

Students admitted to the Radiography program are assigned to the West Campus at the time of admission. Lecture and Lab simulation experiences are delivered at the West Campus. Clinical experiences take place at affiliated healthcare agencies throughout Central Florida.

Complete Before Submitting the Secondary Health Sciences Application

Item	Details
Attend an Allied Health Information Session	Virtual and in-person Allied Health Information Sessions are offered each term to review program requirements. Visit valenciacollege.edu/HealthInfoSessions for the current schedule, presentation slides, and pre-recorded sessions.
Review Program Requirements	Confirm that you meet all program requirements outlined in this guide, including completion of required prerequisite coursework, minimum overall GPA requirements, and the ATI TEAS composite score requirement.
Confirm Eligibility – Program Participation Requirements	Before applying, applicants must meet the following eligibility requirements: • Applicants must be 18 or older by the <u>start date</u> of the program • Eligible applicants include U.S. Citizens, U.S. Permanent Residents, International Students and individuals with Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA), Temporary Protected Status (TPS), Refugee, or Asylee status. • Applicants who are not U.S. Citizens or Permanent Residents must have a valid Employment Authorization Document (EAD) for clinical placement purposes. Graduates are eligible to sit for the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT) Radiography Certification Exam; however, a valid Social Security Number (SSN) is required for clinical placement, licensure, and employment in the state of Florida.
Apply to Valencia College	Submit a Valencia College admission application and complete ALL steps outlined in Steps to Enrollment. <i>Note} This is the General Admission application and not the Secondary Health Sciences Application–</i>
Meet with a Student Success Coach	After applying to Valencia College, students are strongly encouraged to meet with their assigned Student Success Coach early and regularly while completing prerequisite coursework. Ongoing advising support helps ensure all admission and eligibility requirements are met prior to submitting the secondary health sciences program application.
Submit Transcripts	Submit high school and college transcripts from all institutions attended. Transcripts must be posted to your Valencia College record before submitting the secondary health sciences program application deadline (recommend 3 months prior). Students using credit by exam (such as AP, CLEP, or IB) for prerequisite coursework must request official score reports from the appropriate testing agency. <i>Transfer students are not considered }Arst time in college and are not required to submit a high school transcript–</i>

Verify Transfer Courses Equivalency (if applicable)	Transfer courses may need to be reviewed for potential course substitution or equivalency. This must be completed <u>before</u> submitting the secondary health science application.
Complete Program Prerequisites	All required prerequisite courses must be completed with a grade of C or better prior to the application deadline. Refer to the Admission Requirements section for full details.
ATI TEAS Testing & Score Submission	Applicants must earn a minimum composite score of 58.7 on the ATI TEAS exam. You may take the ATI TEAS up to three times within a 12-month period, however you must allow 30 days between retakes. The 12-month period begins at the date of a first attempt. Applicants who take the ATI TEAS exam outside of the Valencia College Assessment Center must request official scores from ATI. After requesting scores, applicants must complete the ATI Score Matching Request Form so scores can be properly matched to their Valencia College record.

Radiography Program Admission Requirements

To be eligible for selective admission to the Associate in Science Degree in Radiography program, applicants must meet all minimum requirements by the application deadline.

How to Apply to a Health Science Program

Applying to the Radiography Program is a two-step process. Applicants must complete both the Valencia College General Admission process (if not already active) and the secondary Health Science Program application by the published deadline (pg. 1).

Steps to Apply	Description
Confirm Valencia College Student Status	Before applying to a health science program, applicants must have an active Valencia College student status. New students must first submit a General Valencia College Application
Submit the Secondary Health Science Application	Access the Secondary Health Science Application, then select the desired Health Science program during the published application window at: valenciacollege.edu/apply-health . - Applications must be submitted using your MyVC username and password - Applicants attempting to access the application outside the published window will encounter an error message.
Application Support	- If you receive an error message during the published application window, contact healthscienceapplications@valenciacollege.edu - Valencia College employees using a @valenciacollege.edu email address must contact the same inbox for assistance.
Submit Application Fee	- Pay the \$15 non-refundable application fee - Applications are not complete—or reviewed—until payment is received

What Happens After You Apply

Application Review Process: Applications are reviewed approximately four to six weeks after the closing deadline. Applicants who meet all minimum admission requirements will be ranked and selected through a competitive review process. Admission decisions are communicated via the applicant's MyVC email.

Admission Decisions

Decision Type	Description
Selected	Offered admission into the Program. Applicants must confirm acceptance by the stated deadline to secure their seat.
Alternate	Offered placement on the alternate list. Applicants must confirm acceptance of their alternate status by the stated deadline to remain eligible to be offered a seat if one becomes available. Admission is not guaranteed.
Not Selected	Met minimum admission requirements but was not selected due to limited program capacity.
Ineligible	Did not meet one or more program eligibility or admission requirements by the application deadline.

Requirements If Selected for Admission

Mandatory Program Orientation: All students selected for admission must attend the Program Orientation, which is held prior to the start of the program.

RADIOGRAPHY Core Performance Standards For Admission and Progression

Radiography is a practice discipline with cognitive, sensory, affective, and psychomotor performance requirements. Based on these requirements, the following list of "Core Performance Standards" has been developed. Each standard has an example of an activity or activities, which a student will be required to perform while enrolled in the Radiography Program. These standards are a part of each Radiography course and of the professional role expectation of a Radiography Technologist.

For the Radiography Program, a “qualified individual with a disability is one who, with or without reasonable accommodations or modifications, meets the essential eligibility requirements for participation in the program.” The School of Allied Health at Valencia College makes no preadmission inquiries concerning an applicant’s disability status. Information related to an applicant’s disabilities is not a part of the information reviewed by the Admission Committee.

These Performance Standards should be used to assist students in identifying the academic and clinical expectations for all students. Students needing reasonable accommodations to fulfill required program outcomes or clinical expectations are encouraged to contact the [Office for Students with Disabilities](#) to engage in an interactive process regarding their request. Critical Thinking	Ability to make sound clinical judgments.	Analyze radiographs, select proper techniques, assess patient conditions, and respond to emergencies.
Interpersonal	Ability to interact respectfully and effectively with diverse individuals.	Build rapport, show empathy, work calmly in high-stress healthcare settings.
Communication	Effective verbal and written communication in English.	Explain procedures, understand patient concerns, document care, and read charts/orders accurately.
Mobility	Physical ability to navigate clinical environments safely.	Move and position patients, operate mobile equipment, and transport devices without injury.
Motor Skills	Fine and gross motor coordination for safe patient care and equipment use.	Position equipment, handle sterile materials, administer CPR, stand/walk for extended periods.
Hearing	Adequate hearing to ensure patient safety.	Detects normal speech, alarms, and calls for help from across a room.
Visual	Visual ability sufficient for observation and assessment necessary in Radiography	Observes patient/client responses, graphic monitors
