
More than two out of every five students pay nothing out of pocket for tuition and fees.

This includes students who paid \$0 in tuition and fees after support from grants, scholarships, and waivers (does not include loans).

Tuition and fees at Valencia College have not increased since 2014. If tuition and fees were adjusted for inflation, the current rate in 2025 would be \$144 per credit hour.



In 2024 - 2025, only 22% of enrolled Valencia College students took out a loan to support their educational experience. For students who took out a loan, the average loan amount was \$5,973.


Incoming transfer students and those who leave without earning a credential are excluded to narrow the data for this specific question.

Valencia College tuition and fees are 1/2 the cost of a state university and 1/10th the cost of Florida independent colleges and universities.

Valencia College has actively pursued ways to reduce the cost of textbooks for our students, from an average cost of \$109 per course in 2014-2015 to \$73 per course in 2025.
