## **Active Learning Certification**

The Active Learning Certification is designed to support part-time and full-time faculty in transforming students from passive listeners to active learners while improving learning and deepening understanding.

As a result of the coursework, faculty will learn how to engage students more deeply in the learning process through meaningful lessons while promoting student reflection of understanding.
