Valencia College seeks a passionate, dedicated and motivated senior leader to serve as the College's Foundation Vice President and Chief Financial Officer. This position is a member of the Foundation's Senior Leadership Team and reports to the Foundation President and CEO.

As Foundation Vice President and CFO, you will be responsible for the overall fiscal management of Valencia Foundation, including guiding the finance team, external auditors and investment portfolio advisers. This leader oversees scholarship and program disbursement, in addition to assisting with overall foundation staff leadership, policy development and board relationships, such as finance committee management and engagement.

Valencia College

Valencia College is a member of the Florida College System, a network of 28 state colleges under the purview of the Florida Department of Education, and is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges.

Valencia is one of the largest community colleges in Florida and the inaugural winner of the Aspen Prize for Community Colleges. The College offers more than 120 programs including two- and four-year degrees, accelerated training and continuing education.

As as one of "The Great Colleges to Work For" by the Chronicle of Higher Education, we understand the importance of fostering a collaborative collegial environment that fosters collaboration and creativity and achieving a true work/life balance.

Valencia has been named by HBCU Connect as one of its top 50 employers for recruitment efforts targeting students and graduates from our nation's Historically Black Colleges and Universities.

Serving the greater metro Orlando area, some of Valencia's campuses are located near Walt Disney World and the tourist corridor, in which many residents work. The College's program offerings seek both to support the tourism industry as well as to diversify regional employment opportunities in the region and enable economic mobility.

Valencia College Foundation seeks to provide the margin of excellence for which Valencia has long been known. The Foundation is a separate, not-for-profit, IRS approved 501(c) (3) corporation chartered in 1974 to provide financially for the educational needs of Valencia College that cannot be met through state aid or student tuition income.

Working here, you will have the opportunity to ensure that equal access to higher education belongs to everyone, because the future does, too. The Foundation maintains more than 650 named scholarships, academic support funds, endowed teaching chairs and fellowships.

During the 2019-20 academic year, the foundation disbursed \$7.96 million, which included \$2.64 million for scholarships. In the past 10 years, the Valencia College Foundation disbursed \$39.6 million.

In 2011, the Valencia Foundation received the unsolicited national Circle of Excellence Award in Educational Fundraising from the Council for Advancement and Support of Education (CASE).

The Valencia College Foundation has been named one of the nation's top two community college endowments every year for 17 years and maintains more than \$100 million in net assets.

CASE selected Valencia as one of 10 topperforming community college foundation based foundations based on VSE, IPEDS and NACUBO data. As this benchmarking list continues to expand over time, Valencia has maintained its inaugural position. Among the nation's 1,200 two-year colleges, the average endowment value is \$12 million; Valencia's endowment value is more than \$80 million.

The Valencia College Foundation is committed to providing even greater

opportunity for students through its \$30 million, multi-year Valencia Promise Campaign, raising funds to support 14 priorities through four pillars:

- **1.** Make education affordable and accessible by breaking down barriers;
- **2.** Grow our community's economy by enhancing and expanding signature programs;
- **3.** Lead individuals into high-wage jobs by training them for high-demand careers; and
- **4.** Innovate learning by fostering collaboration and experimentation.

POINTS OF DISTINCTION FOR VALENCIA COLLEGE

- Many colleges and universities rightly claim cultures that are mission-driven, student-focused, team-oriented, transparent and open to divergent opinions. Valencia College exemplifies these characteristics. This culture, championed by President Shugart, has been key to the College's success.
- Valencia College is Florida's second largest state college, having served nearly 78,000 students in 2018-19. Contrary to the countercyclical trend across the community college sector, Valencia's enrollment increased 4.6% over the previous year.
- Valencia College won the inaugural Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence in 2011.
- In 2017, the College was recognized as a "Great College to Work For" by the Chronicle of Higher Education. It was one of only 42 institutions named to the Chronicle's Honor Roll.
- This year, Valencia College has been named by HBCU Connect as one of its top 50 employers for recruitment efforts targeting students and graduates from our nation's Historically Black Colleges and Universities.
- Valencia's YouthBuild program, which provides opportunities for outof-school youth, aged 16 - 24, to complete their GED, as well as Valencia's Basic Construction program, where students have the opportunity to put their construction skills into practice on projects with Habitat for Humanity in Osceola County.

• Valencia awarded 8,759 total associate degrees in 2018-2019, which included 7,096 Associate in Arts and 1,483 Associate in Science and Associate in Applied Science.

• The College's unique DirectConnect[™] to UCF partnership provides graduates with an A.A. or an articulated A.S. degree from Valencia and guaranteed admission to UCF. One out of four UCF graduates started at Valencia. The College

also enjoys many other partnerships with educational institutions.

- With the support from a \$224,999 National Science Foundation Advanced Technical Education grant, Valencia College is developing an Engineering Technology Associate in Science specialization in supply chain automation, as well as providing supply chain automation training to secondary school teachers.
- Valencia's annual **economic impact** on its surrounding area totals more than \$1 billion.
- The Valencia Foundation boasts one of the country's largest community college endowments, with a

market value of \$75 million

in March 2019. The Foundation raised \$6.6 million during the 2018-19 fiscal year.

• The Foundation is conducting the \$30 million Valencia Promise Campaign,

raising funds to support affordability, signature programs, training for highdemand careers and innovative learning approaches.

- Supported by the National Science Foundation, the Louis Stokes Alliance for Minority Participation (LSAMP) is a program designed to help diversify the STEM workforce. By participating in this program as the lead institute in the Central Florida STEM Alliance, Valencia has worked diligently to increase the successful transfer of
- historically underrepresented minority students into STEM majors and enhance those experiences for students.
- Valencia College celebrates several important traditions each year, including the Student Government Association Dinner at the Campus President's home, President for a Day, the Student Development Thanksgiving Dinner and the Meet Your Professor Campus Kick-off in the fall.
- In 2018-19, eight Valencia College faculty and staff members were recognized with the prestigious **John and Suanne Roueche Excellence Award** from the League for Innovation in the Community College.
- Valencia's **financials are in good order** with repeated balanced budgets, a healthy fund balance and clean audits.

Strategic Impact Goals College Access

Valencia College will work with community partners to ensure that, by 2030, 80% of Orange and Osceola County high school graduates of each race and ethnicity will attend a post-secondary institution – including vocational or technical school, college or university – in the year following high school graduation.

Graduation

By 2030, the five-year graduation rates for degree-seeking students of each race and ethnicity will exceed 50%, so that more than half of all degree-seeking students of each race and ethnicity who enroll at Valencia College in the 2025-26 academic year will complete an associate degree from Valencia by summer of 2030.

Transfer Success

By 2030, 65% of students of each race and ethnicity who earn an A.A. or A.S. degree from Valencia College and enroll in a baccalaureate degree program at the University of Central Florida or Valencia College will earn their bachelor's degree within four years of starting a baccalaureate degree program.

Career Credentials

By 2030, Valencia College students will earn 12,000 high-quality workforce credentials each year. These credentials will include A.S., B.A.S., and B.S. degree completions, accelerated skills training and postsecondary adult vocational certificate (PSAV) completions, and qualifying technical certificate completions. To move toward equity in educational attainment and factoring in expected changes in demographics, we would expect at least 50% of these credentials to be awarded to Hispanic students and at least 25% to be awarded to Black students.
