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
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Advisor Responsibilities

- My goal is to make sure you understand all you need to know about your degree requirements at Valencia College.
- I will provide a safe space for you to discuss your concerns and I will listen, be present, respectful, and genuine.
- Our resources are endless! I will always point you in the right direction if you connect with me.
- I will help you with your questions about colleges and universities you are thinking about transferring to and what it takes to get there.
- Helping you find a major and a career that is right for you is my goal. I will provide you with information and support you along the way.
- This is your journey, but you are not alone! I will help you select your courses, understand your prerequisites, create your plans and set goals.

Student Responsibilities

- I will connect with my **advisor** every semester.
- When I schedule an appointment, I will start thinking about what I want to talk about.
- I will bring my "note-taking tools" with me to my appointments (e.g., phones, tablets, or good old paper and pen).
- We will be going over important information, so I will keep all of it handy and refer to it often.
- If my advisor refers me to any resources, I will be sure to follow through and I will stay in touch.
- I will take responsibility, know the deadlines, ask questions, stay on track and be the one to know what to do.



What is Pre-Professional Health Advising?

In addition to the above stated **Advisor Responsibilities**, the purpose of Pre-Professional Health Advising is to discuss:

- Details specific to the pre-professional health academic and career pathway
- Other considerations to help the pre-professional health student to prepare for admission into graduate level health professional schools

What is a Pre-Professional Health pathway?

A Pre-Professional Health pathway is any pathway that leads to graduate level medical professional programs (Masters or Doctoral level). Students will select their degree of choice and can typically expect highly competitive admissions to their future schools. In addition to exceptional academics, competitive candidates will display community involvement, leadership experience, and relevant extracurricular activities

Pre-Professional Health pathways include:

- Pre-Medical (MD, DO)
- Pre-Dental (DMD, DDS)
- Pre-Pharmacy
- Pre-Veterinary
- Pre-Physician Assistant
- Pre-Physical Therapy
- Pre-Occupational Therapy
- Pre-Optometry
- Pre-Podiatry
- Pre-Chiropractic

What should I major in?

- Students can select any major as long as admissions requirements are met
- There is no requirement that students must earn a science degree as long as they consistently perform well in their degree of choice
- Students should major in an area of interest where they can earn their best grades
- Consider using degree and career exploration resources to help decide what bachelor's degree to pursue and then meet with advisor to map out Valencia courses
- Some common UCF majors for Pre-Professional Health students include Biology, Health Sciences, Biomedical Sciences, and Kinesiology
- Students pursuing majors outside of science, health science, or kinesiology will need to complete additional science courses at the four-year university to satisfy admissions requirements for their program of choice

Other Health Pathways:

The following health science pathways are also offered at Valencia College, and are not considered Pre-Professional pathways:

Nursing:

- Nursing, Traditional Track, A.S.
- Accelerated Track in Nursing (ATN), A.S.
- RN to Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) at Valencia College
- Nursing, Valencia/UCF Concurrent ASN-BSN

Allied Health:

- Cardiovascular Technology, A.S.
- Emergency Medical Services
- Dental Hygiene, A.S.
- Diagnostic Medical Sonography, A.S.
- Health Information Technology, A.S.
- Paramedic Technical Certificate
- Radiography, A.S.
- Respiratory Care, A.S.

While there is some overlap in prerequisite courses, the degree requirements and time in school vary based on pathway selected. Students pursuing degrees in nursing and allied health would need to complete additional coursework if also pursuing a Pre-Professional health pathway.

It is important to note that A.S. degrees in nursing and allied health are not required for the Pre-Professional health pathway.

Developing Your Academic Plan at Valencia

It is important to tailor the Associate in Arts degree coursework to your future bachelor's degree

Your AA degree includes

36 credits of general education courses

- Communications
- Humanities
- Mathematics
- Science
- Social Sciences

24 credits of electives

Use these to help cover prerequisites for your intended degree pathway

Classes needed for graduate level health professional schools:

Required courses differ by health profession and can sometimes vary school to school, but basically include:

- General Biology
- General Chemistry
- Organic Chemistry
- College Physics
- Mathematics (must pick Algebra math path)
- Statistics
- Biochemistry (not offered at Valencia, must be completed at the junior or senior level at the university)
- Additional science and math coursework (additional science courses and math up to calculus may be recommended or required depending on health professional school)
- Additional recommended courses such as psychology

Where to Complete Prerequisites:

Students should start science and math prerequisites while pursuing their AA degree, and these courses will count toward general education and elective requirements for the AA.



Pre-Professional Health Expectations

Students desiring a graduate medical education must make their education a priority in their life. A well-rounded applicant would have:

Strong GPA and Academic Foundation

- Overall GPA & Science GPA should both be around 3.5 or above to be a competitive applicant for health professional schools
- All of your classes are important and all grades count
- Writing skills are just as important as your science and math skills!
- Building the foundation to prepare you for future classes

Experiences and Extracurricular Activities

- A well-rounded applicant shows the ability to balance rigorous courses, high academic achievement, unique experiential activities, and community involvement
- You can tailor your experiences to the health professional schools you are interested in applying in
- Be sure to keep a journal or spreadsheet for ease of tracking your experiences

How Do I Run My Degree Audit?

The degree audit is a great tool to help you plan out your courses. It is a summary or audit of your degree. It will show you the classes that you have completed and the ones you have yet to complete. Here are the steps on running a degree audit. We encourage you to consult with your advisor.

- 1. Log in to Atlas.
- 2. Click on Students on the left hand side.
- 3. Look for the Path to Graduation box and click on My Academic Progress (Degree Audit).
- 4. Click on Generate New Degree Audit.
- 5. Select the term you are currently in, click submit.
- 6. Click on the button next to the name of your degree.
- 7. Click on Generate Request.
