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## Prewriting

There are many resources available to you as you begin working on your writing assignments. Prewriting resources can help you analyze the assignment, plan, generate ideas, brainstorm, and create basic organization.

### Face-To-Face Support

## Drafting and Revising

### Face-to-Face Support

Your best bet will always be to reach out to your professor during office hours to discuss drafts, to go over feedback, and to develop strategies for revising.

In addition, visiting the Communications Center (4-120) or a [Live Tutoring Assistance](#) session can be a great way to further clarify feedback or get a check-in on how your draft is looking.

## Editing and Proofreading

The editing and proofreading phases of the writing process are often where students want the most help because grammar is one of the most visible and obvious aspects of writing. **While the online tutors and Brainfuse can provide you with instruction on grammar, the goal of these services is not proofreading.** Instead, the goal is to teach you the skills so that you can become an effective editor and proofreader of your own work.

### Face-to-Face Support

As always, reaching out to your professor during office hours to discuss grammar, go over feedback, and develop a proofreading plan is always your best bet!

For additional assistance, tutoring in the Communications Center (4-120) or a [Live Tutoring Assistance](#) session can assist you in learning how to proofread. Again, tutors are not proofreaders. Tutors are there to assist you in learning how to identify grammar issues and give you the tools to proofread your own work.

### Other Support

If you do not require live assistance during the proofreading and editing phases, you may consider submitting your essay to BrainFuse and receiving written feedback. Again, the tutors are not proofreaders and will not proofread your essay, but they will identify grammar issues and explain how to correct and avoid them in the future.
