Proper Adjectives	Yes/No	When a term is used descriptively, as opposed to being an actual part of a proper noun, do not capitalize it	The <u>California</u> <u>deserts</u> do not get as hot as the <u>S</u> ahara <u>D</u> esert. (California is describing "deserts")
Family relationships	Yes/No	Capitalize names of relationships <i>only</i> when they are a part of or a substitute for a person's name.	I sent a thank-you note to <u>A</u> unt <u>A</u> bigail, but not to my other aunts. Here is a present I bought for <u>M</u> other. Did you buy a present for your mother?
